- There are over 200 different names and titles for Jesus. Which title or name means the most to you right now? Why?

Read About

- What has Jesus inherited that the angels do not have (v.4)?
- ➤ What 2 words are repeated in v.5? What description have the angels never been given (v.5)?
- ➤ What did God instruct the angels to do (v.6)? When did they do this? See Luke 2:13-14.
- ➤ What 2 words describe the nature of angels (v.7)?
- ➤ How long will Jesus' throne will last (v.8)?
- ➤ What does Jesus love and hate (v.9)?
- > When did Jesus lay the foundations of creation (v.10)?
- ➤ What will perish, and what will remain (v.11-12)?
- > Where have angels never been asked to sit (v.13)?
- > For what core function have angels been created (v.14)?

- How does Jesus' superiority over angels impact us today? How does this impact your relationship with Jesus?

Hebrews 1:4-14

- ⁴ So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs.
- ⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say,
- "You are my Son; today I have become your Father"?

Or again,

- "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"?
- ⁶ And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says,
- "Let all God's angels worship him."
- ⁷ In speaking of the angels he says,
- "He makes his angels winds, his servants flames of fire."
- 8 But about the Son he says,
- "Your throne, O God, will last for ever and ever, and righteousness will be the sceptre of your kingdom.
- You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy."
- 10 He also says,
- "In the beginning, O Lord, you laid the foundations of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands.
- 11 They will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like a garment.
- ¹² You will roll them up like a robe; like a garment they will be changed.
- But you remain the same, and your years will never end."
- 13 To which of the angels did God ever say,
- "Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet"?
- ¹⁴ Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?
