## Small Group Questions

### Hebrews 2:14-18

#### Talk About

- What is one food that you never want to taste again? Why?
- How did you feel when you realised that someone who you initially thought was *infallible* and a hero, was actually imperfect and flawed?
- Go around the group and each share THREE words that describes or summarises your Christian life at the moment.

#### Read About

- What does Jesus' death and resurrection destroy (v.14)?
- What causes mankind to be held in slavery (v.15)?
- Who does Jesus help, and not help (v.16)?
- What position does Jesus fulfill "in service to God" (v.17)?
- What did Jesus endure when He was tempted (v.18)? Why

#### Think About

- What do we learn about Jesus' incarnation from this passage? What characteristics did He take on as a human?
- Is there a difference between temptation and sin? If so, what is the difference?
- Why did Jesus become a man?
- How is it beneficial for us that Jesus was tempted like we are? What lessons can we learn from Him about how to respond to temptation?
- You could end by reading / memorising Hebrews 2:17.

## **Hebrews 2:14-18**

<sup>14</sup> Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death – that is, the devil – <sup>15</sup> and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. <sup>16</sup> For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants. <sup>17</sup> For this reason he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. <sup>18</sup> Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.

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
