- > Why does Nehemiah care about Jerusalem (v.1-4)?
- Why does Nehemiah confess his sins along with the sins of Israel (v.5-7)?
- > What was Nehemiah's career path (v.11)?

Respond

- In what practical ways can we deepen our personal prayer times with God?
- Nehemiah wept and fasted over the condition of his people. How should we respond to the needs of our church and local community?
- You could end by memorising Nehemiah 1:11 "Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of this your servant and to the prayer of your servants who delight in revering your name."
